2. DO I NEED TO READ “KNOWING YOUR TOOLS”?

Yes!

If you have not yet done so, one of the best things you can do to equip yourself to use the *KING OF GLORY Illustrated Study Guide* is to read the guide's 8-page introduction called *Knowing Your Tools*. It will orient you to the **What, When, Why, Where, Who, and How of the KING OF GLORY resource collection** (movie, picture book, study guide, etc.) and may even get you excited about using it!

3. WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I DIFFER WITH SOME MINOR POINT IN KING OF GLORY?

Relax!

It is helpful to understand that the answers in this *Answer Key* come from the text of the *KING OF GLORY* book and movie, which flow straight from the Bible, but at times the answers will reflect the way I, the writer, have interpreted or imagined the details of a particular story. For example, Scene 42 says,

“One day some excited Magi (wise men who study the stars) arrived in Jerusalem. Led by a special star, these men had come from faraway Persia in search of the newborn King.”

Does the Scripture say they were “excited”? No, but the circumstances and dialogue imply that they were. Does the Scripture say they came “from Persia”? No, it just says that they came from “the East,” which would be from the direction of ancient Babylon and Persia. Furthermore, the word “Magi” originally referred to a class of Persian wise men who were interpreters of signs.

The point is that in writing a book such as this (intended to give people the big picture of God’s plan of redemption), we must not get lost in peripheral details or debate. In condensing and telling God’s story and message in a way that captivates and clarifies, we cannot stop to explain every point or word on which biblical scholars may not be in perfect agreement.

Getting back to the Magi, here’s one of those fun, but non-consequential questions: *how many Magi followed the star to Bethlehem to worship the newborn King?* Three? We don’t know because the Bible **does not say**. To affirm that fact (and just for fun), *KING OF GLORY* shows five Magi! Oh, and don’t miss the scene where they ride their camels right past the stable with its manger, since the Scripture **does say**, “On coming to **the house**, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him” (Matthew 2:11).

4. HOW PRECISE DO MY ANSWERS NEED TO BE?

Very.

On foundational matters about God, man, sin, and salvation, where the Bible speaks plainly, we too want to be very clear. In most cases, the answers provided in this *Answer Key* give the word-for-word response found in the *KING OF GLORY* movie, which is a word-for-word presentation of the picture book. But when leading a *KING OF GLORY* study group, it is important to give students freedom to answer in their own words. If their answer is in line with what the Bible teaches, then their answer is correct! Sometimes they will give just part of the answer, which can also be acceptable.

5. WHERE DO I FIND THE ANSWERS FOR THE “DISCUSS” PART?

In the Bible.

However, for the most part, you will also find the answers in the *KING OF GLORY* movie/book! But this *Answer Key* does not provide a list of answers for the **Discuss** questions. This is intentional, since:

1. The answers to many of the discussion questions may vary and, at times, go beyond what is covered in *KING OF GLORY*.
2. Many of the questions in the **Discuss** part of the study guide are also covered in the **Reinforce** exercises, which means that many if not most of the answers to the **Discuss** questions are found in the *Answer Key*. This is because **Discuss** and **Reinforce** cover much of the same material, as we advise in the *Knowing Your Tools* introduction:

“Some groups may only use the first two pages of each episode (INTRODUCE, WATCH, DISCUSS, REFLECT), skipping the REINFORCE exercises. This works well with adults, or when time is limited. Similarly, if the REINFORCE exercises are used, to keep a class from going too long, the DISCUSS questions could be skipped.”

6. IS IT OK TO ADMIT “I DON’T KNOW THE ANSWER”?

Yes.

Remember, “Discuss” means that the list of questions are to be discussed, but this does not mean that each person can come up with his or her own idea. Rather, the goal is to help each participant discover what God has revealed in His book, the Bible, which records and explains His story and message. It is OK if students and group leaders don’t have all the answers. Be humble. And don’t be afraid to say, “It seems that we don’t know the answer to this question, but let’s dig into the Scriptures this week, ask the Lord to teach us, and we’ll talk about it next time.”

Here’s a good prayer for all of us:

Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law.

GOOD NEWS

- A** The right answer to the question "*What must I do to be saved?*" can be expressed in various ways, but here are the basic elements: To be saved from the eternal punishment that God's holy law requires for your sin, you must believe that the Lord Jesus Christ suffered and died in your place for your sins on the cross and then came back to life, "the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18).
- B** God's good news for sinners is that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and was raised from the dead three days later. "All the prophets testify about [the Lord Jesus Christ] that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name" (Acts 10:43).
